The Bambino Gesù Foundation supports the reception of children and families with major financial discomforts, the international activities and the humanitarian commitment of the Bambino Gesù Hospital which yearly takes care of children from over 30 different nations. Children untreatable in their own countries- or with no health coverage - who need prompt- and sometimes very expensive – medical treatments. An outstanding daily commitment grounded on the right to medical care for all the children, with no distinction of race, sex, language or religion.

In 2019 the social campaign in aid of research for rare and ultra-rare diseases evolves to focusing on medical training and care for children in their countries of origin.

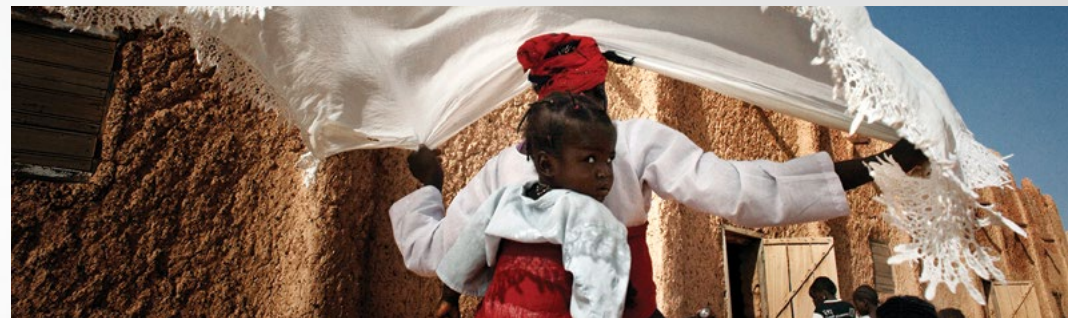
In fact, concerning the international front, the Bambino Gesù Pediatric Hospital has set up relevant healthcare projects in eleven countries of the world: Russia, China, Syria, Cambodia, Jordan, Ethiopia, Central African Republic, Palestine, Georgia, Tanzania and India. A commitment supported by the Bambino Gesù Foundation towards doctors, nurses and qualified personnel who work in the countries where such projects are active. Behind every achieved result lies the passionate work of many people, the ongoing willingness towards excellence and innovation, and the young lives, treated and assisted in their journey towards a coveted healing.

FRAGMENTS OF LIGHT

That's the name of the social campaign dedicated to the reception and care of children humanitarian children. Reminding us that everyone is part of a humanity that interacts influencing the surrounding environment and therefore making the difference.

Light is the symbol of the social project, to enhance the role that every one of us has - or can have – igniting a spark in support of the reception and care of suffering children who ask for help from any part of the world.

In the last few months The Bambino Gesù Foundation has supported the reception and care of 39 humanitarian cases from different areas of the world, including Africa, Middle East and Eastern Europe.



Children suffering from serious illnesses, such as tumors, rare and ultra-rare diseases or wounded by war weapons. Each of these children has a hard story to tell, like the girl from Syria, torn by a bomb, to which the surgeons of the Bambino Gesù are recreating the face, or the 4 months old baby from Ecuador, suffering from a rare disease that brought him to the other side of the world for a possible cure.

Our main purpose is to receive and take care of as many children as possible. Children who couldn't survive in their own countries and to whom we must offer the gift of hope.
